Why Saint Leo?

Initial Project Group:

Since the first cohort is being treated as a Demonstration Project, Saint Leo University has agreed to a discounted rate of \$600 per student. It is anticipated that the cost will be split \$300 from the student and \$300 from the student's diocese.

Future Students:

On an ongoing basis, the full four-course certificate program will cost \$900 per student. It is an anticipated that the cost will be split \$450 from the student and \$450 from the student's diocese. Grant funds will be sought to help defray a portion of this cost.



REQUIREMENTS:

Prerequisites

• For certificate and credit programs: Letter of recommendation from the applicant's Chancery or Diocesan head of prison ministry (or, at their direction, applicant's parish pastor or other priest who will be providing pastoral supervision to the applicant's activities in prison and detention ministry).

And –

- For Certificate Program: High school completion level fluency in reading and writing, as evidenced by a high school diploma or G.E.D.
- For Undergraduate Credit: Successful matriculation as an undergraduate student.

Standards for Certificate and Undergraduate Program:

Each module will have a post-test or assignment to demonstrate mastery of the subject matter.

General Policy Issues:

Because the entire program is provided online, student participation is available from anywhere in the world.

- Applicants must be comfortable with online activities and able to handle the program with tutorial help;
- Saint Leo University's highly respected online format makes the program user-friendly and accessible to the average layperson called to prison and detention ministry as a volunteer

- Participants will demonstrate a grasp of the significance of prison and detention ministry as a component of the Church's core mission of evangelization.
- Participants will demonstrate a grasp of the means of catechesis in prison and detention ministry and the use of Sacred Scripture, the Catechism and the social justice teachings of the Church in order to authentically present the Christian message.
- Participants will demonstrate a grasp of the role of evangelization in prison and detention ministry as a component of the overall catechetical activity of the U.S. Church.
- Participants will demonstrate a grasp of the basic foundational principles of Catholic faith and of the teachings of the Catholic Church.
- Participants will demonstrate a grasp of the basic spiritual, communal and catechetical practices necessary to the formation and maintenance of Catholic prison ministers.
- Participants will demonstrate a practical understanding of the proper interaction between Catholic Christians and other Christian denominations, as well as other faiths, in Catholic prison and detention ministry.
- Participants will demonstrate a practical understanding of the interpersonal and social skills necessary for social interaction in the prison and detention setting with all stakeholders, including inmates and detainees, their families, friends and advocates, officers and staff, administration and government officials, and crime victims and their families.
